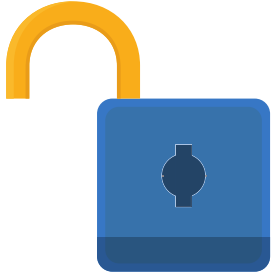


Six Common Syllable Types



Closed Syllable

- Ends with a consonant
- Short vowel sound
- Examples: *map*, *lad|der*



Open Syllable

- Ends with a vowel
- Long vowel sound
- Examples: *he*, *fro|zen*, *a*



Magic e

- Vowel + consonant + silent 'e'
- The silent 'e' makes the preceding vowel long
- Examples: *late*, *hope|ful*



Vowel Team

- Contains two or more vowels that form one sound
- Vowel sounds vary
- Examples: *boat*, *joy|ful*



R-controlled

- Contains a vowel followed by 'r'
- The 'r' changes the sound the vowel makes
- Examples: *bird*, *work|er*



Consonant -le

- Contains a consonant followed by 'le'
- The 'le' part of the syllable usually says /ul/
- Examples: *fiz|zle*, *mar|ble*
